



PROMOTING PEACE EDUCATION ACROSS EUROPE

Teach Peace is an Erasmus+ project that develops peace education for adults. The objective of Teach Peace is to create a peace education training programme for adults. The project also aims to develop adult educators' competences in helping their learners resolve conflicts, and to promote a culture of dialogue and peace and participation among European adults. The project began in September 2025 and will last until December 2026.

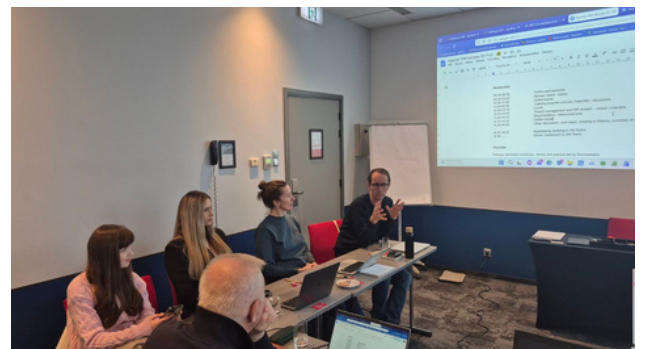


KICK-OFF MEETING IN KAUNANIEN, FINLAND

On 8- 9 September, the partners of the Teach Peace consortium gathered in Kauniainen, Finland, to officially launch the project. The meeting marked the beginning of a shared journey dedicated to promoting peace and dialogue through adult education. Partners had the opportunity to meet face-to-face, build team spirit, and plan the first stages of project implementation — including the research phase and project management practices.

2ND PROJECT MEETING IN WARSAW, POLAND

On 10–11 December, the partners for the second transnational meeting. Hosted by Let’s Talk Foundation, the event focused on analyzing the results of extensive surveys conducted among adult educators and trainers in 5 partner countries. During the meeting, partners also began designing the structure of the upcoming training programme, focusing on practical tools for dialogue and cooperation to ensure the project effectively meets the real-world needs of educators.

GROUP DIALOGUE SESSION IN TALINN, ESTONIA

On 2 December 2025, a small group of adult educators and peace education promoters met at the Estonian Dialogue Academy in Tallinn for a group dialogue as part of the Teach Peace project. Participants from diverse fields reflected on peace education as a vital tool for understanding perspectives and practicing non-violent communication amidst rising social polarisation.



RESEARCH PHASE

As part of the Teach Peace project, we recently completed the research phase — an important first step toward developing a peace education training programme for adult educators across Europe.



Between October 2025 and January 2026, our partner organisations conducted surveys with two distinct groups: adult educators who work with adult learners, and trainers already active in the fields of peace education, dialogue, and conflict resolution. In total, we gathered responses from 93 adult educators and 53 peace trainers. This dual approach allowed us to understand both perspectives, ensuring the training programme we develop will be truly relevant and practical.
